

Summer Reading Club begins Wednesday, June 1

Download the **Beanstack Tracker** app or visit http://franklinpubliclibrary.beanstack.org to register for the Summer Reading Club!

If using the app, search for Franklin Public Library (WI). On the Sign-In screen, click "Don't have an account? Sign Up" to create your profile. If you already have a profile, log into your account with your existing username and password. Follow the on-screen instructions. You may register as an individual or family. A phone number may only be used once to create an account.

Each age group has a summer reading program!

Children (0-5th grade): Log the minutes you read each day. Teens (6th grade-12th grade): Log the minutes you read each day. Adults (18 and older): Record each book that is read.
